Study Tips for Finals

5. What do you know about your final?

- Does it test over what you learned the entire semester?
- What types of questions will it contain? How many questions?
- How much will the final exam count towards your final grade?

4. Manage your review time.

- Start studying in short increments at least 1 – 2 weeks before the exam.
- Block out a set amount of time each day for studying.
- Make note cards and carry them with you. You can take them out and review when you have an extra 5 – 10 minutes.
- DO NOT CRAM!
 - * Cramming is not the same as learning.
 - * Cramming is more work and increases anxiety.
 - * Cramming won't replace reading, daily attendance or homework.

3. How do you review?

- Organize your notes.
- Use flashcards, summary sheets, mind maps, etc.
- Do cumulative reviews.
- Study from previous quizzes and tests.
- Review alone and with a study buddy or study group.

2. Take care of yourself.

- Get plenty of rest.
- Eat healthy meals.
- Have some time for fun!

1. How to take your test.

- On the exam jot down memory aids that you think you may need on the exam.
- Read the directions carefully.
- Scan the entire test before you begin.
- Answer the easiest questions first.
- If you get stuck move on and come back to that question later.
- Look for answers or hints in other test questions.
- Do not change your answer unless you are positive it is wrong.
- Use all of the time allowed.
- Relax. If you feel yourself tensing up, close your eyes for a minute and take some deep breathes. Stay positive. Repeat positive statements to yourself.
