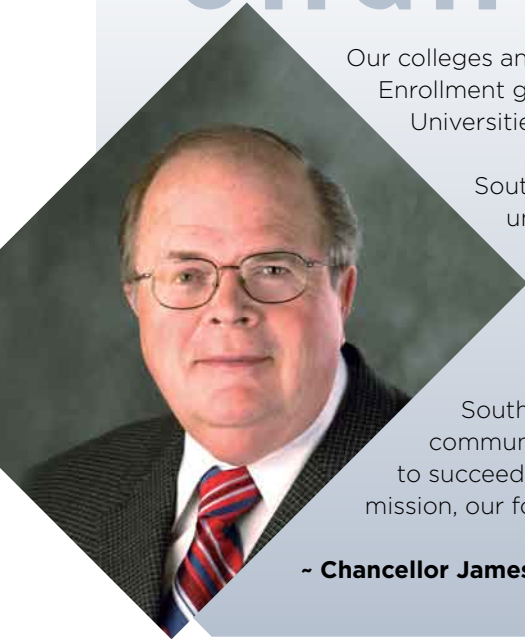

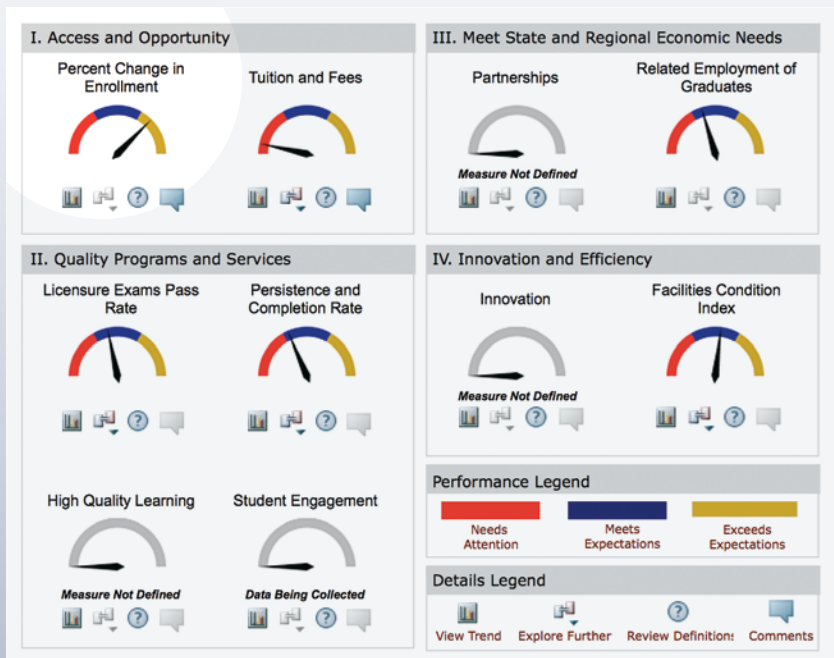

This past year has been one of major achievement at South Central College. We have spent a great deal of time planning for our future with the goal of providing greater access and more opportunities for our students. Our major accomplishments include:

South Central College just completed the college's 2009-2013 Strategic Plan and is embracing the work on the following goals:

SCC's Vision, Mission, and Purpose Statements were revised and approved by the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities Board of Trustees on May 20, 2009, as part of our Strategic Planning process.

SELF-STUDY

SCC members have spent the past two years involved in a self-study to improve our institution. The outcomes have been numerous and include increased services for students and improved processes in preparation for the Higher Learning Commission Re-Accreditation visit (February 1-3, 2010).

ENROLLMENT GROWTH

South Central College has recognized 21.3% growth in enrollment during the previous four academic years and has positioned itself to grow even more in the future. This growth in enrollment for 2008-09, gained SCC a "gold status" on our accountability dashboard with the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities system.

NEW PROGRAM

SCC rolled out a new Mechatronics Engineering Technology major during Fall Semester 2009, thanks to the support of many business and industry partners who provided the initial financial support to hire faculty members to design the curriculum and purchase the needed equipment a year before the program started. Additional financial support came from a \$1.98 million grant from the United States Department of Labor.

BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE

South Central College completed the pre-design phase for a major classroom renovation and addition to our Faribault Campus. This project is ranked #15 in the requests by the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities system for the coming Capital Bonding session of the Minnesota Legislature. We believe that the creation of a more collegiate atmosphere will assist in our efforts to educate a higher percentage of our citizens and will ultimately provide a better learning environment for increasing numbers of students.

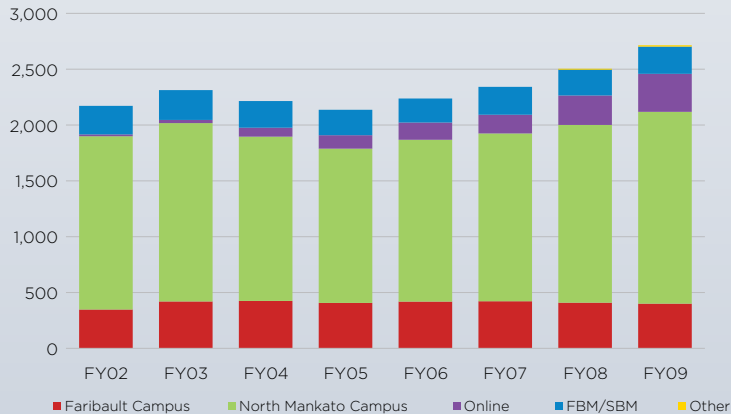

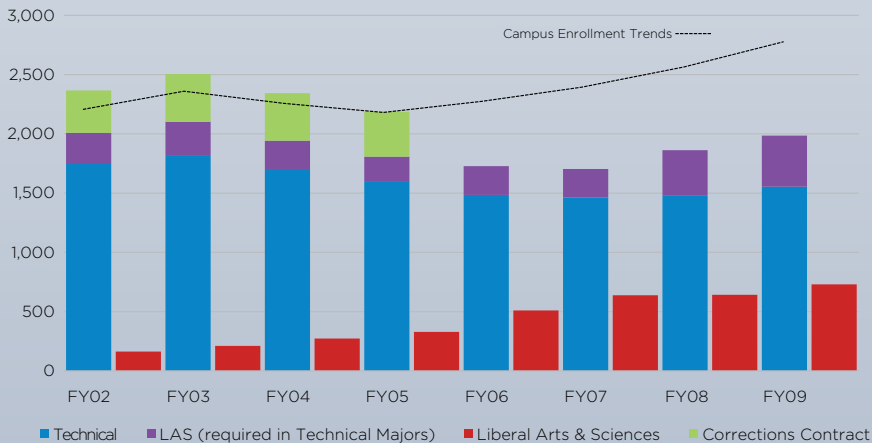

FYE BY CREDIT TYPE



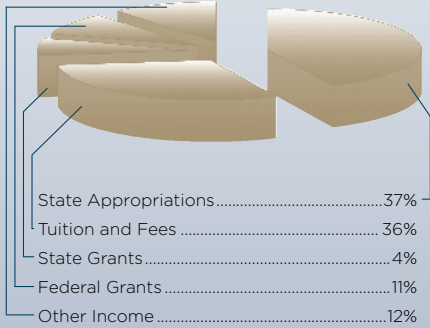

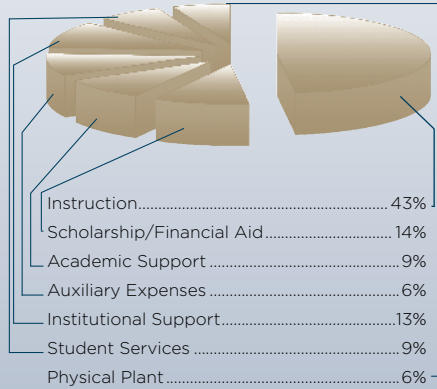

Accomplishments

Support Student Success

- Student life opportunities have increased and include several new student organizations such as the Intercultural Student Organization, Anime Club, Film Club, and a Chicano/Latino Organization.
- SCC has established multicultural activities on each of its campuses. Initial accomplishments include establishing a student mentor program, allocating space for a multicultural center for students on the North Mankato Campus, and the formation of several new student organizations.
- The English for Speakers of Other Languages program plan was restructured. Accuplacer scores were established for placement at SCC, MSU,M's transitional Adult Basic Education course, and the school district's Adult Basic Education.
- A framework for Associate of Arts concentration areas was developed for Biology, Chemistry, English, Communications, and Visual Arts.
- Online accessibility to library databases was increased.
- The renovation of three smart technology classrooms was completed on the Faribault Campus.
- Retention Committee accomplishments included Student Success Day, preparations for First Year Experience implementation, investigating GPS, gathering resources on intrusive advising, and other best practices.
- Updates to the advising resource handbook are in progress and will include plans for intrusive advising.
- The IPESL tutoring initiative provided study groups for six different science courses.
- The AIM program offered services to students on academic probation.
- SCC created an Anatomy/Physiology lab on the Faribault Campus.
- The Physics lab was co-located with the Physiology lab on the North Mankato Campus.
- SCC has partnered to use the Chemistry lab in the Faribault High School.
- Curriculum Committee restructured the process for course development and approval.
- This year, SCC has added new Physics, Chemistry, and Physical Education courses.
- The delivery of a "hybrid" Microbiology course was piloted.
- Kirstin Cronn-Mills, SCC Liberal Arts and Sciences faculty member, received the Instructor of the Year Award from the Minnesota State College Student Association.
- Jeff Fischer, SCC Computer Integrated Machining instructor, received the Advisor of the Year Award from SkillsUSA.
- Michael Zarn, SCC Marketing Education Instructor, received the Advisor of the Year Award from Delta Epsilon Chi (DEX)
- SCC honored Tom Edwards, Computer Careers instructor, for his commitment to global education and his coordination of eleven trips to Germany for students and staff for the CBIT Technology Fair.
- Student life opportunities continued to develop and included an enhanced website with calendar information, utilization of social networking sites, and the creation of a Campus Activities Board to plan events.
- Technological improvements included availability of wireless network access, additional network storage solutions, and ITV room upgrades.
- Study space was added in the North Mankato Library.
- SCC co-hosted the STEM Summit with MSU,M on our North Mankato Campus.
- The Faribault and North Mankato Campus Foundations allocated \$276,550 in scholarships to 359 SCC students.

Enhance Student Access

- The first courses for the Construction Field Supervision program rolled out fall term on the Faribault Campus.
- SCC piloted LAS course offerings on Saturdays during spring term.
- The Accounting program initiated an evening completion option on both campuses.
- SCC offered Small Business Management, Child Development, and Community Social Service programming at Owatonna College and University Center.
- The Computer Machining Technology program on the Faribault Campus initiated the use of a flex lab and hybrid curriculum to enhance program delivery.
- Curriculum and lab preparations began for the fall 2009 opening of the Mechatronics Engineering Technology program. This year the program received over 2 million dollars in grants to support the development, recruitment, and implementation of the program. As part of this funding, Mechatronics Technology Education (MTEC) piloted a shared work program this spring.
- Both the Architectural Drafting and Construction Field Supervision programs transitioned to laptop programming.
- SCC provided six concurrent courses to 101 high school students.
- Mathematics faculty began investigating possible bridge program options.
- SCC hosted Project Lead the Way (PLTW) training on SCC campuses and provided funding for scholarships for teachers. Additionally, as part of the college's Department of Labor grant, the college is coordinating mobile equipment purchases for use by schools participating in PLTW.
- This summer's ZAP camps included approximately 50 middle school students on SCC's campuses.
- Results to SCC's market research study identified potential markets and messages for the future. This study was utilized in the development of the college's new Strategic, Academic, and Marketing and Recruitment Committee plans.
- SCC recruiters attended community-focused events that target non-traditional students. The college's financial outreach initiatives targeted adult groups in the community. Student Affairs partnered with the Mankato and Faribault ABE/GED offices. SCC produced a view piece specifically for non-traditional student populations.
- A revised schedule with multiple start dates was implemented for summer term.
- Online course offerings increased by 25 percent this fiscal year.
- The college hired a grant writer in August. The college has identified institutional priorities and has successfully secured over 2.3 million dollars in funding, including a Department of Labor CBJT grant for 1.98 million dollars.
- Schematic design work for the Faribault Campus bonding request was completed.
- Pre-design plans for the North Mankato Campus have been enhanced.
- ITV room usage increased by 27 percent this fiscal year.

Nurture Relationships

- SCC Mechatronics Engineering Technology program and our industry partners received the Brian Fazio Business-Education Partnership Award from Greater Mankato Growth.
- SCC implemented its 2nd Annual Global Connections Conference in April with approximately 1,500 students and community members attending. Highlights included keynote presentations by Sexeng, the Hmong artist, educator and activist and Joseph Makeer, one of the Lost Boys of Sudan.
- Student Affairs and the Center for Business and Industry partnered to provide college program information to dislocated workers through the South Central and South East regional workforce centers.
- SCC and ISJ-Mayo Health System have established a collaborative arrangement between simulation staff for training and simulation skill sets. This summer, SCC will begin the creation of a simulation center on the North Mankato Campus.
- The MLT Apprenticeship program was implemented and resulted in a partnership with Pine Technical College and discussions for a 2+2 University of Minnesota partnership.
- SCC's Center for Business and Industry conducted health care and manufacturing summits in the Faribault area to assist in the development of program and training options.
- The college continues to be an active member of Minnesota State University, Mankato's Center for Engineering and Manufacturing Excellence initiatives.
- SCC conducted 10 business visits in the fall on behalf of the college and the MnSCU system.
- Ten staff and faculty members graduated in May from SCC's Leadership Academy. A total of fifty employees have gone through the program since its inception five years ago.
- Linda Beer, Dean of Students and Dena Colemer, Director of Research and Planning graduated from the MnSCU Luoma Leadership Academy in July 2008.
- SCC hosted the first annual "New Tools for New Rules: An Agricultural Symposium."
- President Stover was named Greater Mankato Diversity Council's Champion of Diversity.

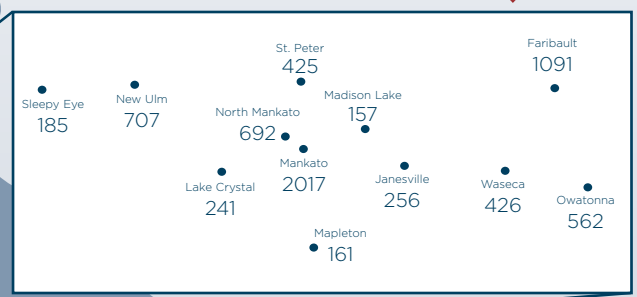

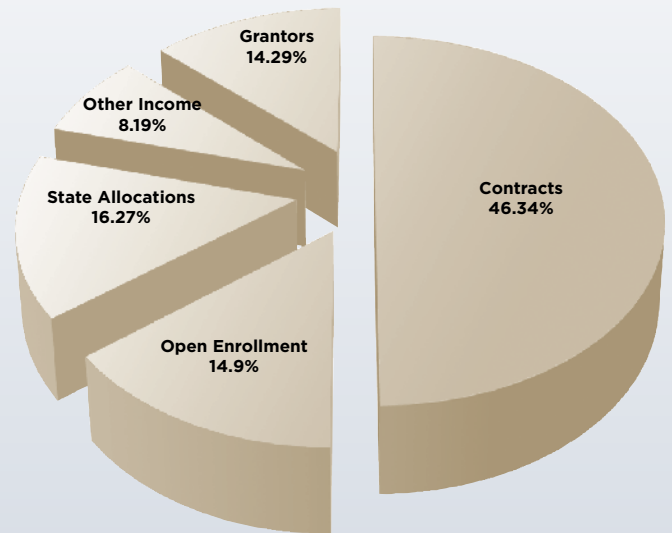

Mechatronics Technology Education Center

The visionary leadership of Dennis Siemer, CEO and President of V-TEK, played a significant role in the creation of the Mechatronics Engineering Technology program at South Central College. As SCC's Electronics program closed due to a loss in enrollments, Denny envisioned a program that combined a broader cross-section of skills and worked with industry partners and the college to define the required workforce talents.

SCC's Dean of Engineering and Construction Technology, Dr. Suzanne Nordblom, worked in collaboration with a number of electronics manufacturing leaders to answer their need for electronics technicians who possess skills in electronics, mechanics, pneumatics, hydraulics, and computer control systems. A dedicated group of volunteers came together to serve as the steering committee for the program to draft the curriculum. Douglas Laven, SCC alum, past faculty member, and former President of V-TEK was hired as the first instructor for the new program.
